Imperial Record Department to National Archives of India:

A Quasquicentennial Journey (1891-2016)

In the year 2016, National Archives of India is celebrating the 125th anniversary of its foundation. This sentinel of the nation's documentary heritage was established at Calcutta (now Kolkata) as the Imperial Records Department on 11 March 1891, and was transferred to Delhi following the transfer of capital in 1911. From 1947 onwards it came to be known as the National Archives of India and its valuable corpus of archival heritage includes public records, oriental records, cartographic records, private papers of eminent personalities and microfilms, and manuscripts, all of which constitute a rich documentary heritage of our country and forms an invaluable source of information for the administrators, scholars and other users. Today, it has one Regional Office at Bhopal and three Records Centres at Bhubaneswar, Jaipur and Puducherry.

125th FOUNDATION YEAR CELEBRATIONS: A CURTAIN RAISER - 11 March 2015

Milestones (1891-2016)

	Imperial Record Department came into existence at Calcutta and Prof. G.W. Forrest was appointed as Officer in charge.

Journey forward: Challenges and Milestones

The Advisory Committee, in its First Meeting on 21 April, 2015 headed by the Secretary, Ministry of Culture (see box) illuminated the way forward to mark the 125th anniversary of the NAI in a befitting manner. The Implementation Committee, (see box) with the assistance of a specially created Commemoration Cell, undertook the onerous challenge to spearhead a number of activities not only at the NAI's headquarters at New Delhi, but also across its regional office & three regional centres.

The focus was to utilize this opportunity as a watershed year in the history of NAI in terms of outreach, digitization, branding initiatives and access. The Abhilekh Patal emerged as an invaluable resource, dissolving physical boundaries of space and time for the Research scholar. For the period between 11th March 2015 and 1st February 2016 -

- 9,042 users from 109 countries have visited the website.
- 99,858 pages have been viewed on the website

- 2,069 users have registered on the website.
- Average time spent by a user on the portal: 8 minutes 46 seconds
- Average pages viewed per session: 7.45 pages
- Total Number of Active Records on the Portal: 23,73,834

Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Papers

The Government of India had decided to declassify the files relating to Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose and make them accessible to public. This was announced by Shri Narendra Modi the Prime Minister of India on 14 October 2015 when he met a delegation of members of Netaji family at his residence in New Delhi. The first lot of 33 files which were declassified were handed over by the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) to National Archives of India on 4 December 2015.



Branding Initiatives

On the occasion of 125th anniversary of Foundation Day, the National Archives of India organised two contests for the designing:

- a logo for 125th Anniversary Celebrations, and
- an emblem for National Archives of India with a suitable tagline.

The announcements for the contest were made on MyGov portal and other sources like Facebook page and website of the department.

Both contests received encouraging response. 262 entries were received for the logo, while 1,310 entries for the Emblem with a tagline.

The emblem and a tagline giving the National Archives of India its distinct institutional identity will be released during the Grand Finale to these celebrations on 11 March 2016.

- Emblem: It depicts the line drawing of the facade of the heritage building of the National Archives of India set against brown colour that signifies the historical and archival character of its holdings.
- Tagline: Sanskrit phrase वयं अधिलेखान् रक्षामः Vayam Abhilekhan Rakshamah or 'We Protect Records' carries the ethos of the work and commitment of the National Archives of India as the sentinel of the nation's documentary heritage.

The logo for the 125th Anniversary was prominently incorporated on an array of promotional stationary brought out during the celebrations which included coffee mugs, mouse pads, signages, desktop calenders, etc., on this occasion.













Digital Initiatives @ NAI: A Year of Historic Firsts

A critical component of the 125th Foundation Year celebrations was the renewed commitment towards digitization.



11 March, 2015: Launch of Abhilekh-Patal

Launch of Abhilekh -Patal

On 11 March 2015, working within the overall national mission of Digital India, a full featured web-portal

"Abhilekh patal" was launched by the Honorable Minister of Culture, Government of India, to enable access to the digitized data of NAI and its reference media (Catalogue of Records) by worldwide users. This portal consists of 2.3 million reference media and over 12,000 digitized images from the record holdings of NAI.

Another historic first was the launch of the de-classified and digitized files relating to Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose by the Honorable Prime Minister of India on 23th January 2016. In the first phase, the digital copies of 100 files have been put in public domain under the URL www.netajipapers.gov.in.

Future Perspectives: preservation and proactive management

As part of the Government of India's initiative under Digital India, the National Archives of India has charted an ambitious programme to take a giant leap in the digital world. It has already signed a MoU with Centre for Development of Advanced Computing (C-DAC), Pune for streamlining the digital preservation of electronic records - both for born digital and burn (formatted) digital records, under the initiative of the Ministry of Communication and Information Technology.

The C-DAC team is also engaged in the formulation of standards for digital records in NAI. The outcome of this Project will enable NAI to develop the digital preservation capabilities of e-records in fulfillment of the mandate of the Public Records Act of 1993, and also to take care of the electronic archives. Incorporating the ISO standards for Open Archival Information System (OAIS) and Trusted Digital Repository, and through a research for over four years, the C-DAC has designed an integrated workflow from start to end of the records management process and is included in 4 customized software:

 Abhilekh Digitalaya: an Open Archival Information System (OAIS) which helps in long-term preservation of digital records;



E-Rupantar: Enables in managing in implementing the digitization best practices;



 E-Sangrahan: a software tool for acquisition of digital records received from various depositors, and



 Records Reporting System: an online reporting mechanism for compliance of various statutory requirements by the Departmental Records Officers (DROs), under the Public Records Rules, 1997



Digital Preservation Training

With a view to build up the technical capabilities in the digital field, the NAI, in association with C-DAC conducted preservation Workshop for archivists and record officers, from 8-10 February, 2016.




Besides the display and installation of the 125th Foundation Year Logo, the Centre organised various activities to disseminate a better understanding of its holdings through outreach initiatives such as:




