




Shri Ratansi Purshottam came to Muscat in 1855 at the age of 14 to gain experience in his ancestral firm M/s Natha Maccan. In 1867, he started his own business in the name of "Ratansi Purshottam". The digitization of these archives started on 19th May 2024 under the supervision of Shri Vimal and Dhruv Purecha (4th& 5th generation of Ratansi Purshottam family) at the Embassy of India in Muscat with the help of the National Archives of India.




A portrait of Shri Ratansi Purshotam






Proposal to lease 'Bait Ratansi', residence of Ratansi Purshottam to the Indian Consulate, 1955




Correspondence between Shri Ratanshi Purshottam and William Hills, Jr. New York, regarding trading and packing of Fard dates dated 27th October 1905

Shri Naranjee Hirjee came to Muscat in 1905 at the age of 18 to start his own business in the name of "Naranjee Hirjee". After Shri Naranjee Hirjee, the business was looked after by his four sons namely Jeram, Hansraj, Chaturbhuj and Keshavji and eventually, the business of Naranjee Hirjee was taken over by Keshavji in 1977 with four sons Mahendra, Sudhir, Mahesh and Narendra. The digitization of their archival documents started on 22nd May 2024 under the supervision of Shri Sudhir Keshavji Sampat (the third generation of the Naranjee Hirjee family) at the Embassy of India in Muscat with the help of the National Archives of India.
